A Message From The Superintendent



Dear Parents, Guardians and School Community Members:

When we began our work to develop the 2020-2021 school district budget, we had not yet been hit by the COVID-19 global pandemic. While fiscal responsibility is always vitally important in our budget development, we fully recognize that the economic impact of the pandemic has been devastating for some of our district families, as it has for the district.

As it currently stands, MCS is set to receive less in state aid than it did for the 2019-20 school year. In addition, NY State has reserved the right to continue to reduce aid to schools should the dire economic situation continue for the state. As you can imagine, this puts the district in a difficult position because our costs have only continued to

The annual budget vote for the fiscal year 2020-21 by the qualified voters of the Madison Central School District, Madison County, New York, will be held by absentee ballot on Tuesday, June 9, 2020. Absentee ballots of qualified voters will be accepted by mail or personal delivery to the Madison Central School District Office up to and until 5:00 pm prevailing time on June 9, 2020, at which time the ballots will be canvased with results announced shortly thereafter.

rise. With that as the backdrop, we have worked hard to develop a budget that maintains existing programming for students - who have already been negatively impacted by the pandemic - while considering the financial capability of our taxpayers to support the district during an economically uncertain time. We firmly believe that we are presenting you with a spending plan that achieves both goals.

At its May 19th meeting, the Board of Education adopted the 2020-2021 proposed budget. Some highlights include:

- Total adopted budget of \$10,975,715, a 3.04% spending increase over 2019-2020
- Reduction in state aid, compared to 2019-2020, of \$143,232
- Tax levy increase of 2.05%, within the property tax cap
- Maintains all existing student academic and extracurricular programming

We are also asking to purchase two new buses, for a total cost of \$252,503.82.

All voting for the budget and Board of Education elections will be completed by absentee ballot. Ballots must be received by the district by 5:00 p.m. on June 9, 2020.

Because of the time restrictions resulting from Governor Cuomo's Executive Order to hold the budget vote on June 9, 2020, this printed budget newsletter is shorter than usual, focusing almost entirely on budget
